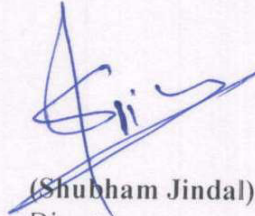

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **QUIKBRICK DEVELOPERS PRIVATE LIMITED**, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at **31/03/2023**, the Statement of Profit and Loss, for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Auditor's Opinion

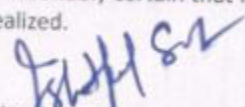
Tax Expenses


Tax expenses comprises of current and deferred income tax. Current income tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Indian Income Tax Act. Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient further taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

If the company has carry forward of unabsorbed depreciation and tax losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty that such deferred tax assets can be realized against further taxable profits.

Unrecognized deferred tax assets of earlier years are re-assessed and recognized to the extent that it has become reasonably certain that further taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.
